- Are there any other important considerations? Explain.

4. READ THE ENDINGS TO THE NARRATIVES OF JONAH, IN "TO TELL OR NOT TO TELL", AND/OR FELICIA, IN "MONEY TROUBLES".

TO TELL OR NOT TO TELL

Jonah began to pull away from his friends, whose behavior he saw as increasingly negligent. Concerned for his own health as well as the safety of others in the community, Jonah felt torn about whether to report his friends' behavior to the school or maintain his loyalty by keeping quiet. He eventually decided to report his friends to the administration anonymously to help keep his school environment safe for all.

Felicia was faced with an ethical decision: should she tell the businessman that she no longer needed his \$2,000 for the jackets, or should she keep quiet and keep the money? In the end, she decided to keep the money and not say anything to the businessman, believing the money could be put to another good use by the student government.
